- From the east entrance, take either the 'Denden Mushi' or the bus bound for the Morioka Bus Center. Get off at the stop in front of the '<u>Q</u> Kencho-Shiyakushomae' after about 10 min., and walk for about 4 min..
- Take a taxi from the east entrance for about 10 min..
